## Program Details

My Architecture Workshop summer program is a licensed non-profit summer day camp. Our program will be hosted at the Strawberry Hill School Barn in Stamford, CT for grades K-8.

The six-week program is designed around S.T.E.A.M. to engage students' minds and imaginations to explore how buildings and cities are designed and built. Through hands on experience students explore architecture through the lens of Natural Sciences, Geography, Mathematics and Art while working toward a collaborative architecture project.

**Dates:** June 30th - August 8th (Closed July 4th)

**Time:** 8:30am - 4:30pm

**Price:** \$1,500 per student

*(Price includes the full six weeks, this program is not available as a per week enrollment)*

*Limited scholarships are available.*

Breakfast, lunch, & afternoon snacks are provided. Students may also bring their own packed lunch and snacks please be mindful we are a nut-free camp.

Every student receives a T-shirt, hat, water bottle, and architecture kid kit for the full six week program.

*Very limited space is available. Our program curriculum builds from one week to the next. If you cannot commit to having your student attend every week of our six-week program, please do not apply.*





# Summer 2025 Program Details

Our summer camp program places K-8 students into three groups based on their current grade:

- Yellow Studio (Grades K-2)
- Red Studio (Grades 3-5)
- Blue Studio (Grades 6-8)

Note: Students must be currently enrolled in kindergarten or above to participate. When a group reaches full capacity, students will be automatically placed on a waitlist.

## **Staff**

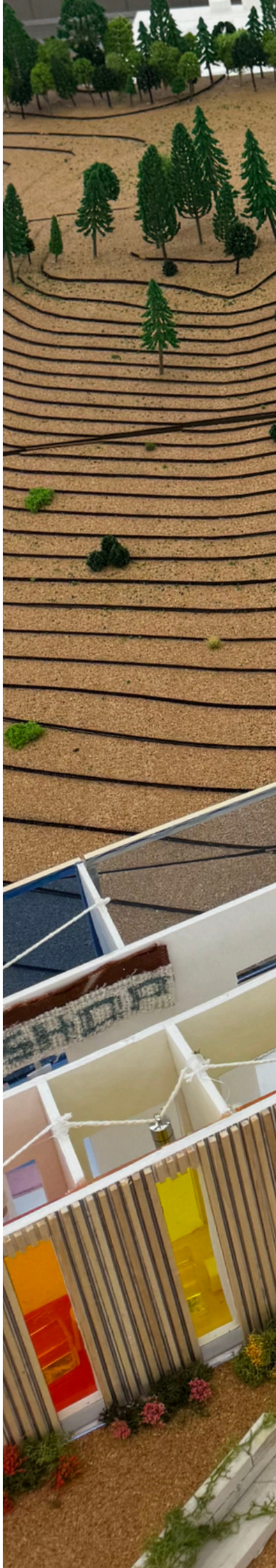
Our camp is led by CT State licensed Camp Directors, and a team of licensed architects, designers, educators, and creatives dedicated to providing an engaging and enriching experience for all campers. Our trained counselor teams, who lead studio activities, consist of undergraduate and graduate students majoring in architecture, engineering, and design. They bring a passion for design and hands-on learning, ensuring that campers receive high-quality instruction and mentorship.

Our summer staff attends a multi-day intensive training and are required to pass background check and obtain mandated reporter certification. All Directors must have CPR and AED certification.

## **Field Trips, Firm Days, & Outdoor Activities**

- Parents will receive advance notice of field trips.
- Permission slips must be signed prior to trip.
- Campers must wear appropriate attire and bring any required items.
- Firm days are curated workshops with local architectural firms. Students are to wear their camp issued shirts on these days





# Summer 2025 Program Details

## Drop-off & Pick-up Procedures

- Drop-off Time: 8:30 AM – 9:00 AM
- Pick-up Time: 3:45 PM – 4:00 PM
- Authorized Pick-ups: Only individuals listed on the camper's registration form will be permitted to pick up your child. A valid ID may be required.
- Late Pick-ups: Parents must notify the camp if they will be late. Late pick-up fees may apply

## What to Bring

- A refillable water bottle
- Comfortable, weather-appropriate clothing
- Closed-toe shoes (No crocks for outdoor play)
- Sunscreen (applied before camp)
- Any approved necessary medications

## Do Not Bring:

- Personal electronics (phones, tablets, etc.)
- Toys or valuables
- Money

## Payment & Cancellation Policy

- Payment Policy: Payment must be made in full prior to the start of camp.
- A camper will not be considered registered until all required payments, applicable fees, waivers, and health assessment forms have been received and processed. Registrations will be processed in order of receipt.
- Cancellation Policy: If you need to withdraw your child's enrollment, you must notify us in writing. Cancellation requests are subject to review and approval based on student relocation and/or a medical doctor's note only.
- Approved cancellations made on or before May 15th will receive a refund minus a \$250 processing fee.
- Cancellation requests made after May 15th will result in the loss of all paid camp fees, with no exceptions.

## Health & Safety Policies

- Medication: If your child requires medication, please submit a medication authorization form.
- Illness Policy: Keep your child home if they are experiencing fever, vomiting, or contagious symptoms.
- Emergency Procedures: In case of an emergency, parents will be contacted immediately. First aid-certified staff are always on-site.

## Required Health Forms

To ensure the safety and well-being of all campers, Connecticut state law requires that all students submit completed health and medical forms prior to attendance. If the required forms are not received before the first day of camp, the student will be unable to participate. Please ensure all forms are submitted on time to avoid any disruptions to your child's camp experience.

## Behavior & Conduct

We encourage a positive and respectful camp environment. Campers must:

- Show respect to peers and staff.
- Follow instructions and safety guidelines.
- Participate actively in activities.
- Refrain from disruptive or harmful behavior.

Failure to comply with behavior policies may result in a parent conference or dismissal from camp.
